PASTOR'S CORNER

This weekend we celebrate the great Feast of the Epiphany, a Feast celebrated since 361 A.D. Tradition and scripture tells us that Wise Men (Zoroastrian priests who worshipped the stars) came from the East (Iran) at the rising of a unique star (the star of the King of the Jews). They came first to King Herod in Jerusalem (who was deeply disturbed, in more ways than one) and finally onto Bethlehem where they found the child Jesus with his mother in a house (no stable and no St. Joseph – he was working). The planning and trip probably took about two years. They (no mention of three wise men) presented gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh (to fulfill the prophecy of Micah) and returned to their country by another way (the encounter changed them, they worshipped the Son of God not the sun and stars of God).

The richness of the story is found in the profound change that an encounter with Jesus the Christ made in the lives of the Wise Men and in our lives. The gift of Jesus was given to all the world not just to the Jews. It is also found in the fact that a relationship with God always takes us out of our comfort zone and reminds us that we are never safe in this world that is dominated by sin. Safety comes with the blessing of obedience. This blessings demands that we reform our lives and that we continue to move forward to both receive and share the many blessings of Peace which Christ offers.

As we being a New Year we rejoice that as a parish we can continue on our faith journey with one another. We rejoice that like the Wise Men we can challenge the prevailing customs, thoughts and anxieties and show that true Peace and Hope are a gift from the Almighty. Journey well for this year is a special and unique time for growth and surrender to the Almighty Prince of Peace.

Many people gift our parish with loving service and sharing of resources. Again our Church looked beautiful because of the work of our Art and Environment committee supported by all those who donated to our Christmas decorations. Our choir praised the Lord like the angles of all and all the other ministries contributed without asking anything in return. 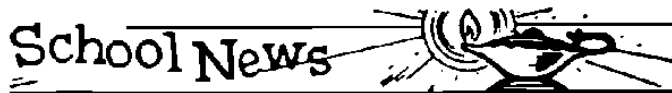

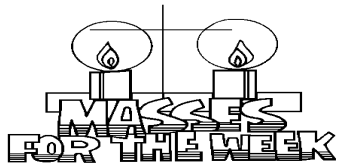
