PASTOR'S CORNER

Today we begin Catholic Schools Week. It has been celebrated every year since 1974. The theme is: **Dividends for Life: Faith, Knowledge, Discipline and Morals.** Catholic Schools Week celebrates education that goes beyond preparation for a secular life — it is education that prepares students for a Christian life. CSW also celebrates the high standards of excellence and the quality of the education available to all students in Catholic elementary and secondary schools across the U.S. The purpose of Catholic Schools Week is to build community awareness of, and involvement in, Catholic schools throughout the country. During this week our Catholic Schools will have wonderful programs highlighting the distinctive character and blessings associate with a Catholic School Education. You are encouraged to contact the schools or the Parish Office to inquire about activities being sponsored by our local schools this week.

Our Catholic Schools in the area are undergoing tremendous stress due to decreasing enrollment and financial constraints but the fact remains that Catholic School Education is vital to the spiritual health of the Church. Compliments of Steve Atzert, I have enclosed part of the theological rationale for Catholic Schools by Sr. M. Paul McGaughey, O.P. for the Archdiocese of Chicago:

“I am discovering the vital importance of telling our story internally, as well as to the general public. Sometimes as Catholics we lose a sense of the power of our own schools.

Catholics have a capacity for something that would be called “magical realism” if it were found in literature. We believe that the whole of reality is charged with grace; that the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Christ. We believe in miracles. We receive this gift best when we are children. Who was it that said “Give me a child for a few years, and I’ll make a Catholic for life?” Whoever it was, they were right. Someone might come to the church as an adult, but they aren’t going to have the same kind of faith as a child.

How are Catholics made? It’s probably similar to how Americans are made. Everyone who attended elementary school had to pass the Constitution test and know how many representatives were in the House of Representatives and other relevant details. Most adults have forgotten all those details (along with a whole lot more), but we’re still Americans. It’s not in the tiny details that we are American. Being American is something you absorb from the environment and something you assent to as you grow.

It’s the same with being a Catholic. It’s not the details. Children absorb this faith thing in school and through their families. They learn that their parents and teachers and all the significant adults in their lives think and feel and believe in a certain way. Children absorb it the same way they absorb language. They don’t have to learn nouns and verbs and direct and indirect objects to learn English. They simply soak it up.”

It’s the same with our faith. Children soak up the faith and are changed for life in our schools. What a tremendous gift to give a child. Not only that, we teach them to read to boot. There is no better way.”

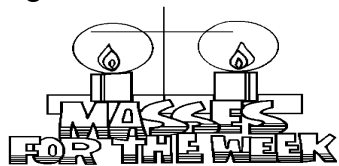
