# PASTOR'S CORNER

The Easter Vigil will be celebrated on Saturday Evening at 8:00pm, no 5:00 pm Mass.  
 Masses on Easter Day will be celebrated at 7:30, 9:00, 10:30 and Noon.

It is again time for Parish Council Elections. If you would like to run for Council or would like to recommend someone please contact the office.

As we make our preparation for Easter, our Scriptures remind us that sin is a constant in our lives. Isaiah, Paul and Jesus all reflect on the role of sin as it undermines community. They clearly understood that the journey into shame and alienation had been the direct consequence of their sinfulness and infidelity to the covenant with God. They also reminded the people that God was willing and anxious to forgive as soon as the people made a movement toward repentance and reconciliation. Jesus challenged the woman in today's reading to "leave sin behind" and to live her life anew within the parameters of God's goodness and righteousness. God has also created an avenue of healing and forgiveness for us through an awareness of sin and the gift of the sacrament of Eucharist and Reconciliation. Some sins are more sinister than others and we are called to personally examine our lives and heed Jesus' call to reform.

One blatant sin is that of Detraction, a sin St. Paul speaks of and one that is terribly detrimental to parish life. This is what the Catholic Catechism says and about Detraction and its sister sin Calumny (gossip): Detraction is the unjust damaging of another's good name by the revelation of some fault or crime of which that other is really guilty or at any rate is seriously believed to be guilty by the defamer.

An important difference between detraction and calumny is at once apparent. The calumniator says what he knows to be false, whilst the detractor narrates what he at least honestly thinks is true. Detraction in a general sense is a mortal sin, as being a violation of the virtue not only of charity but also of justice. It is obvious, however, that the subject-matter of the accusation may be so inconspicuous or, everything considered, so little capable of doing serious hurt that the guilt is not assumed to be more than venial. The same judgment is to be given when, as not infrequently happens, there has been little or no advertence to the harm that is being done.

Jesus, in his love and compassion, writes in the sand and forgives the woman in today's scripture, others walked away without forgiveness. He lifts his eyes to us: What will you do?

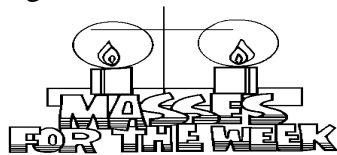
